Parents and Students:

The Number 1 Rule at EHHS is and always has been: **RESPECT**. I notice and appreciate many examples in our students that show respect. It is heartwarming to witness acts and attitudes of respect. Unfortunately, this year we have also seen more disrespect than is tolerable. Parents, would you please visit with your student about the importance of this central rule in our school and in our society? I list below a few thoughts in the areas where we see a need for improvement.

Respecting others

Respecting others includes the concept that there are other people in the school who may not share your particular attitudes, philosophies, opinions, language preferences, etc. and conducting yourself accordingly. We really need to see improvement in this area of respecting others. Bullying, harassment, unwanted teasing, inappropriate and/or vulgar language, inappropriate online (email, Facebook, etc.) comments, are all examples of disrespecting others. Remember the Golden Rule: Treat others as you wish to be treated OR as THEY wish to be treated!

Respecting school property

It is important to be respectful of school property AT ALL TIMES. But, at this particular time when public school funding is so tight, respecting

school property is essential in order to maintain the property we have. THERE IS NO MONEY for the replacement or repair of property damaged or destroyed. In most cases, damage or destruction simply means that the school goes without. And this is flagrantly unfair to students who try hard to respect our property.

Respecting the building and bus

We are having to spend FAR too much money to repair, clean, repaint, and replace items that are being damaged by students who are not being respectful. We recently had to spend over \$3,000 to replace windows broken by students. Graffiti is a bigger problem this year than it has ever been at our school. We see it on restroom walls, hallway walls, on and in books, in and on our school bus, etc. Arms full of paper towels stuffed in and flushed down toilets, sheetrock repair of walls intentionally damaged, trash just carelessly thrown onto the ground or floor, often when trash cans are within a few feet, and so on. Again, these are costly problems many of which are nothing less than needless, wanton and careless vandalism.

Respecting the opportunity for education at EHHS

State taxpayers pay a lot of money for public education and our faculty and staff spend a great deal of time, energy and preparation to

provide the best educational services we can to our students. It is a great opportunity to attend EHHS. Students should respect that opportunity by 1)attending and being on time to each class, 2) conscientiously applying themselves by preparing, completing homework, studying and doing their best to be academically successful.

We love our school and want it to be the very best it can be. Parents, please encourage your student to be more respectful and students, please do your part to respect others, school property, building and bus, and the opportunity for education that is yours at East Hollywood High School!

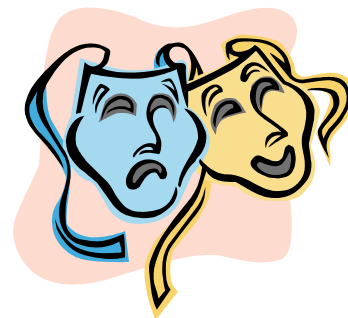
Theater Department

New Career Center: The counseling department opened the new EHHS Career Center just before the holiday break. Parents and students are welcome to check it out! College literature and other hand outs are available, as well as reference books that can be used for help with preparing for college, writing college admission essays, and choosing a career or college program. Computers with access to helpful websites and a list of scholarships are also available. The Career Center will be open before and after school, lunchtime, and as needed during the day. If it is locked and you need access to it, please check with me so I can let you in.



Senior Graduation Status:

Please encourage your seniors to work hard on making up any missing credit, so that they are able to walk with their class in June. I am working with seniors to make sure they have a plan in place to make up the credit they need. In addition to having credit in all their required classes, seniors should have at least 21 credits at this point to be on track to graduate. I will be reviewing graduation status of seniors in the next few weeks. Please feel free to contact me or come in to go over this anytime.

Graduation: Some seniors have not yet contacted Josten's to order their cap and gown. If your senior plans to walk in the graduation ceremony, they MUST order a cap and gown as soon as possible. If you haven't ordered yet, please contact Josten's at (801) 467-6968. The office is located at 341 E. 2100 S. **Graduation will take place at SLCC Redwood Campus in the Lifetime Activities Center, on June 5, 2012 at 7 p.m.**

College-bound Juniors: I highly encourage all juniors to

take the ACT college entrance test in April 2012. The deadline to register for the April test is **March 9**. Register online at www.actstudent.org. Qualified students may request a fee waiver or extended time but these take extra time so please start the process early. I am willing to help with any questions you have. I will be holding a lunchtime workshop on how to be successful on the ACT closer to the date of the test.

Scholarships/Financial Aid:

Seniors planning on attending college should be applying for the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) now. You can access the FAFSA online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Students and parents should visit the website now to register for a PIN number (which you will use as your signature). If you file your taxes online, you can now pull them up on the FAFSA website so you don't have to enter the information twice. **On February 29, 2012 at 7 p.m. we will have a financial aid night. We have experts coming who can help walk you through the entire application and answer any questions you have.** Please take advantage of this opportunity. Students should also be checking the counseling office window, career center scholarship list, facebook, twitter or tumblr pages on a regular basis and applying for scholarships in order to fund college. Many college applications are due February 1, 2012, so make sure to get your application in on time! If you need help with any of this, come to the counseling office.

Sophomore SEOP's: Sophomore SEOP's will be held in groups on Wednesday, January 25, 2012 in the library, during your students' biology class. Parents are invited and encouraged to attend. More information will be sent to you with the correct time. We will be going over information about graduation, careers and preparation

for life after high school, as well as ways students can succeed in high school now.

Freshman SEOP's: Freshmen have already begun career exploration activities. I am hoping to finish this up during the month of January. Freshman SEOP's will be scheduled on an individual basis starting in February. During the SEOP conference, parents and students meet with a school counselor to help the student set goals and follow their progress towards graduation and the future.
